

## Detailed Report re Yettington by Councillor Kevin Quant

**Deteriorating road sign:** Contacted by Highways who requested further images, which I have submitted, along with a paragraph stating if they could not undertake the repair/restoration, residents would be happy to oblige but I would like to have it in writing we would not be liable if any further damage/disrepair occurred. Awaiting a reply to that query.

**Telephone Box:** Have spoken to a number of residents in Yettington regarding the installation of a defibrillator within the box, it has been well received. Looking at the wider picture, not only does it benefit Yettington residents, it could be beneficial for persons using Woodbury Common.

**Bench for Pete Barnard:** After speaking to Sue Barnard, she would like to have the bench sited in the grounds of Yettington village hall. I have sourced one from B&Q, Rosedene Wooden Natural Timber Bench, £175, it has a 15 year guarantee against rot, fully weather proof. Also, Sue would be happy to source and fund a sign with appropriate words dedicated to her husband. She will update me as and when.

**Police Liaison:** John has kindly sent across all the appropriate documents/paperwork associated with this role. I have also spoken to the PCSO who is the contact point for the speedwatch group, regarding keeping me updated with any relevant crime issues associated with the parish.

In respect to the **speedwatch** team in Yettington, I have run through with the team, how to use the speed gun, the recording of the data, relevant health and safety aspects and issued the reflective vests. At present there will be two teams of three and one team of two, hopefully when the scheme has been up and running other residents will come on board. I am hoping we will be in a position to commence week starting 7th June.
